2023-47 DIRECTOR'S REPORT: May 2023

1. Staff: I am so proud of the Herrick DL staff. I have been helping do a little bit of shifting to understand what this will be during the renovation and have had the opportunity to observe staff and patrons as I am doing so. The staff are amazing. They do the regular work of the library and so much more. They are patient and knowledgeable as they assist patrons on the computers. They are thoughtful as they help and recommend resources to patrons, and the resources are varied in format and scope. They listen to those who just need a listening ear. They create and execute thoughtful programs for all ages. We have had miniature horses here this week to introduce the summer reading program, have had a writers' workshop and an informative program on nutrition and sugar

consumption. We have demonstrated VR to those who walked in the library and were interested. We have welcomed and given cards to ESL adults and classrooms of kids. Our teams have been visiting every elementary classroom in the West Ottawa District. Other team members have been working extra time to make sure the outreach team has the pamphlets and needed support for visits. And on top of all of that, the staff have been working on getting ready for the renovation project: weeding and moving collections and shelving, moving extra furniture and reviewing files.

- 2. Management team has been working on plans for the first phase of renovation. The first phase will be working on the southwest corner of the main floor, the children's half of the second floor and the Groundworks and CDR areas of the lower level. We are planning who and what will be moving during the first phase and what services we can and cannot offer during this time period. We will still have some study rooms available, computers will be available, but we will not have any programs happening in the auditorium or the main floor meeting rooms. They will be repurposed as collection space and staff space during the first phase.
- 3. We are experiencing some phone issues right now and have been working for several weeks to resolve those issues. In some cases, the person on the other end of the phone can hear us but we cannot hear them, or vice versa.
